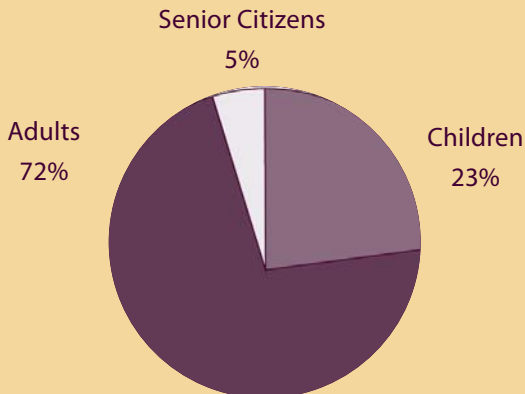


EMERGENCY FOOD ASSISTANCE

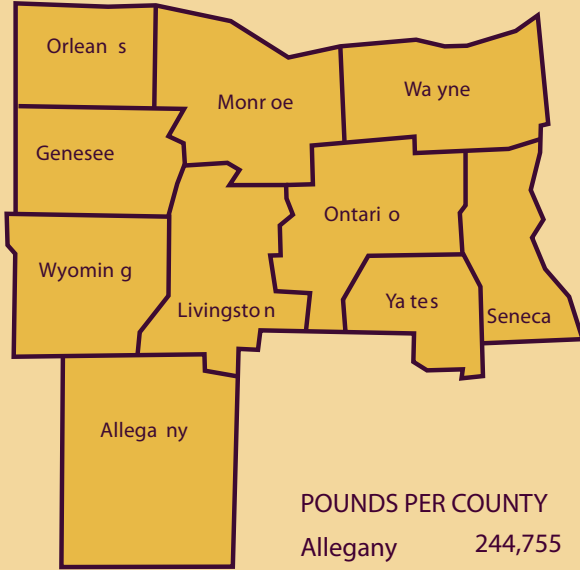

2007-2008 Emergency Meals Served

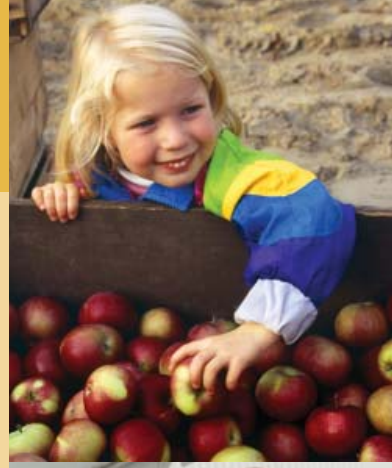

FRESHWISE CATERING

In an effort to address the growing paradox of childhood hunger and childhood obesity, Foodlink launched its Community Kitchen in 2001. Renamed to Freshwise Catering in 2005, the mission is to raise the bar of institutional meals for children by focusing on fresh nutritious foods for our community's youth. The program's strength is in re-creating childhood meal favorites in a new and healthful way, while simultaneously introducing new foods to our youth.



Our fully equipped industrial kitchen prepares over 2,000 hot, nutritious meals daily for delivery to Kids Cafe and Summer Meals sites. Freshwise Catering also offers vended meal service and caters meetings and special events as a social enterprise activity.

In 2008 Foodlink was awarded a grant from the Greater Rochester Health Foundation to implement a holistic approach to community health in a targeted neighborhood of Rochester. Students at Holy Family School received health school breakfasts and lunches from Freshwise Catering, fitness classes, Kids Cafe dinners, and a backpack of healthy food over the weekend. Foodlink also hosted Community Meals and worked on access to healthy foods in the neighborhood.

STEWARDSHIP OF ASSETS

FULFILLMENT CENTER

The Foodlink Farmers Fulfillment Center supports Upstate economic development and job creation by acting as an important link between local farmers and local markets. In the past, after delivering food to non-profits in the 10-county area, Foodlink trucks returned to Rochester empty. Through the Farmers Fulfillment Center, these trucks are now available to local growers and struggling with the logistical barriers to bringing their high quality, fresh produce to market.

FARM TO SCHOOL

Foodlink expanded the Farm to School initiative this year, including new partnerships with West Irondequoit School District, McQuaid Jesuit High School. Additionally, in a second year working with the University of Rochester, the campus became the first college in New York State to join the Pride of New York program in recognition of their dining services reaching 11% of total purchases coming from local sources. Foodlink also sponsored farmers markets at both McQuaid and the University of Rochester, engaging the students in our efforts to rebuild the local food system.

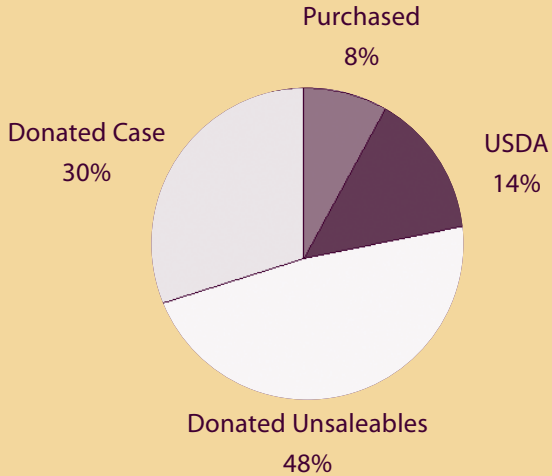
