

Plainview Milk Cooperative Ingredient Recall Information

At a Glance:

Plainview Milk Products Cooperative, Plainview, Minn., is voluntarily recalling a variety of products that it has manufactured over the past two years, because they might be contaminated with Salmonella. The company sells these products to other industry customers, including distributors and manufacturers, who may have incorporated them into their own products. None of Plainview's products were sold directly to the public.

Some of the recipients of these products have begun recalling their products, and the FDA is working with these companies to remove the potentially contaminated products from the marketplace.

Please check your inventory including donation, food drive food, and retail damaged products. Dispose of this product in a manner that prevents others from eating it.

FDA and CDC recommendations for consumers include:

- Do not eat products that have been recalled and throw them away in a manner that prevents others from eating them.
- To determine if commercially-prepared or manufactured product is subject to recall, consumers are urged first to visit FDA's website and check the searchable database of recalled products.
- Persons who think they may have become ill from eating a product containing dry milk are advised to consult their health care providers.
