

## Kreher's donates 75,600 Eggs

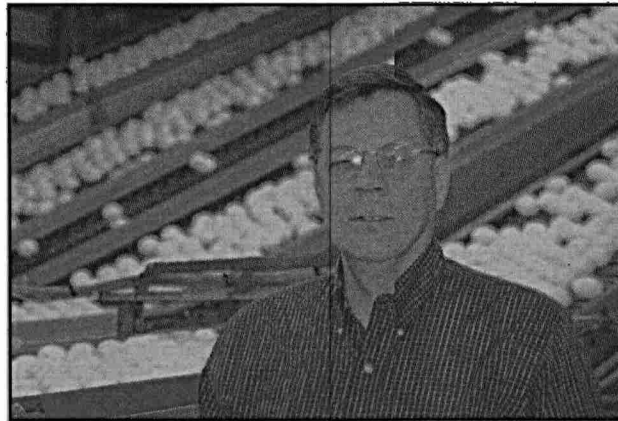

WOLCOTT - Kreher's Farm Fresh Eggs gave the Easter Bunny something to hop about as they donated more than 75,600 eggs to [Foodlink](#), which supplies local food pantries.

"Helping families in need is important to farmers and to our industry," said Scott W. Kreher, one of the seven partners, brothers and cousins, that own and operate Kreher's Farm Fresh Eggs. "We're proud to offer our help and support when our community needs it now more than ever."

Through United Egg Producers and Feeding America, the partnership here in New York and throughout the nation will help feed the nearly 49 million men, women and children across the country who are at risk of hunger.

For three generations, Kreher's Farm Fresh Eggs has been committed to doing what is best for the environment, their farm and the community. Agriculture in general and egg production specifically, may not look the same as it did three

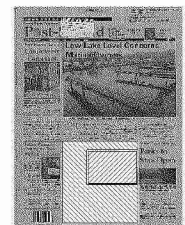


Plant manager John Gingericl proudly stands in front of and behind the product the Kreher family has produced for three generations.

In Wolcott, Kreher's 850,000 laying hens produce up to 9,000 dozen eggs an hour in a plant that employs 75 people. Kreher's produces primarily for Wegman's 75 food stores, but has other customers as well. In addition to the Wolcott plant, Kreher's has a plant in Clarence, in Erie County.

"We're grateful to Kreher's Farm Fresh Eggs for their generous donation of this important part of our food offerings," said Tom Feraro, Foodlink's Executive Director and founder. "We are seeing a dramatic increase in demand and this will go a long way towards helping our community."

Leading up to April 4, egg farmers nationwide will be donating more than 12 million eggs to help make sure America's food banks are well stocked with nutrient-dense eggs.
